YARN USAGE

7-8 years: 550 g

9-10 years: 600 g

11-12 years: 700 g

Duffle Buttons
Circular knitting needle:
3,5 mm
Gauge: 21 sts/10 cm

Knitted in Go handmade's *Cosy* - a wonderfully soft and high quality cotton mix that keeps the shape: 60% Cotton/40% Acrylic, 50 g/100 m.

YARN USAGE

7-8 years: 550 g

9-10 years: 600 g

11-12 years: 700 g

MATERIAL

Duffle Buttons

Circular knitting needle: 3,5 mm

Gauge: 21 sts/10 cm

Specified yarn quantities are indicative.

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

Circumference 74 (76) 80 cm.

Length 46 (50) 52 cm.

Sleeve length 34 (36) 40 cm.

NOTE: Gauge

- it is **VERY** important for the jacket's finished result to respect the gauge.

If worked too loose, the shape will not be maintained, which is why it is important to pay attention to the firmness of the stitches at all times, not just at the start.

ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s) Stitch(es)

N Needle(s)

r Row

Button hole Bind off 3 sts.

In the following row, cast on 3 new sts.

(..) Indicates number of sts per r

for the 3 sizes.

Cosy

- A wonderfully soft and high quality cotton mix



Cosy's thread is perfect for knitted cardigans and sweaters. The thread is relatively lightweight, soft and with a very special elasticity, which keeps the knit beautiful and the shape in place. The nature of the fiber gives a special fluffiness, which is great to knit beautiful sweaters.

It can be said about the Cosy yarn that it is a bit vintage-like in its expression – a yarn that gives warmth and offers a breathable fabric to wear.

Cosy has been awarded the AZO certificate and is thus a yarn that everyone can feel safe using.

60% Cotton/40% Acrylic,
50 g/100 m.



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UK

HOODED JACKET

Sizes 7-8 years (9-10 years) 11-12 years

The hoodie is worked from sleeve to sleeve in garter stitch.

Cast **42 (44) 46** sts on 3,5 mm N and knit in garter stitch.

Increase 1 st on each side every 2. cm
- **15 (16) 19** times = **72 (76) 84** sts.

When the piece measures **32 (34) 40** cm, cast on **61 (67) 68** sts each side = **194 (210) 220** sts.

Knit until height of **12 (12) 12,5** cm is reached.
Divide piece for front and back - **97 (105) 110** sts on each part.

BACK

Decrease 1 st at the neck and knit until the work measures **24 (28) 29,5** cm from the cast on, decrease 1 st and put part on hold.

RIGHT FRONT PIECE

Decrease 1 st at the neck side **9 (10) 11** times = **88 (95) 99** sts.

Knit until work measures **19,5 (20) 21** cm from the cast on, insert **6 (7) 7** evenly distributed button holes - or desired number of button holes.

Knit until height of **21,5 (22) 23** cm and bind off.

LEFT FRONT PIECE

Cast on **88 (95) 99** sts and knit like the right front piece, but increase 1 st x **9 (10) 11** times at the neck side instead of decreasing = **97 (105) 110** sts.

When the left front piece mirrors the right front piece, knit the parts together with the back's sts = **194 (210) 220** sts.

When piece measures **12 (12) 12,5** cm after knitting parts together, bind off at the beginning of the next 2 rows: **61 (67) 68** sts for a total of **72 (76) 84** sts.

Now work on sleeve, dec 1 st on each side, then knit **2 (2) 2** cm (*start decrease at the same place as the other sleeve*).

Repeat decreases every 2. cm,
to a total of **15 (16) 19** times = **42 (44) 46** sts and both sleeves are the same length.
Bind off.

HOOD

Cast on 6 sts, then pick up **66 (72) 76** sts from the neckline, through the outer loops.

Start at the right front piece after the first 6 sts and finish 6 sts before the end of the left side part, then cast on 6 sts = **78 (84) 88** sts.


Knit until the piece measures 6 cm, then increase by 15 sts evenly distributed within the central **66 (72) 76** sts (*6 sts on each side are folded*) = **93 (99) 103** sts.

When the work measures **11,5 (12) 12,5** cm, increase by 15 sts evenly distributed within the central **81 (87) 91** sts (*6 sts on each side are folded*) = **108 (114) 118** sts.

When the work measures **23 (24) 25** cm, divide the work as to have two pieces of **54 (57) 59** sts each. Knit pieces together, binding off at the same time. *Fold the 6 sts on both sides and sew them to the hood.*

ASSEMBLY

*Sew sides and sleeves together.
Weave in ends and sew on buttons.*



Good to know

Needle Size ≠ Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.

Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.



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
